RESTORED CORNER FOR OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY

One quarter corner common to Sections 27 and 34 T2N, R7W, W.M., Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL

14" x 10" x 8" stone in place, ½ on N face (now badly deteriorated) from which a:

34" Hemlock bears N240W 8 1ks.; now 36" 10 ft. high stub badly rotted.

30" Hemlock bears S61°W 21 lks.; now 24" 8 ft. high stub, partially uprooted and badly rotted.

RESTORED

Set 12"x36" galvanized iron pipe with 3" bronze cap marked "OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY 4 S27 S34 1954 RE 2311," 34 inches in ground, and inmound of rock, with remains of original stone on N edge of pipe, from which a:


29" Fir snag bears S81°E 63.0 ft.; scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S34 BT RE 2311.

53" Fir snag bears N59 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E 73.6 ft.; scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S27 BT.

Fir snag BT.
Set 4"x4"x72" white Cedar post 1.5 ft. SW of pipe.
