$\frac{1}{4}$ -section corner of Sections 6 and 7. From this corner:

Dead Fir 16" diameter (original B.T.) with the original scribe marks clearly visible bears North  $67\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West 13 links distant. There is no trace of the yew or stone that are called in the original survey notes.

Begin at the corner of Sections 6 - 7 of Township 1 South, Range 6 West, W. M. and 1 - 12 of Township 1 South, Range 7 West, W. M. and run South  $1^{\circ} 43'$  East. Variation  $22^{\circ}$  East.

$\frac{1}{4}$ -corner of Sections 7 and 12.

Begin at the  $\frac{1}{4}$ -corner of Sections 7 and 12 and run North  $84^{\circ} 51'$  East on the true center line of Section 7 to the  $\frac{1}{4}$ -corner between Sections 7 and 8. Begin also at the  $\frac{1}{4}$ -corner between Sections 6 and 7 and run South  $4^{\circ}$  West on the true center-line of Section 7 to the  $\frac{1}{4}$ -corner of Sections 7 and 18. At the true intersection of the centerlines of Section 7, set an iron pipe  $1\frac{1}{2}"$  x 30" and raise a mound of stones for the center corner of Section 7, Township 1 South, Range 6 West, W. M. From this corner:

Dead Fir 64" diameter bears North  $63^{\circ}$  West  $16\frac{1}{2}$  links distant.

Dead Fir 60" diameter bears North  $83^{\circ}$  East 47 links distant.

No trees or bearing objects available South of the corner.
