CORNER COMMON TO GOVERNMENT LOTS 1 & 2 SECTION 6 T.5S., R.10W., W.M.
(EE 1/64 S.6, T.5S., R.10W., W.M. & S.31, T.4S., R.10W., W.M.)

S 31 I found a 2" iron pipe with a 3" Bureau of Land
EE 1/64 Management Brass Cap, (see T.C.S. B.L.M. Microfilm
S 6 Records fiche 6 of 6), and encased in 10" concrete
1962 cylinder.

History of found monument

I found this monument to be as described in said T.C.S. Microfilm
and the references found and/or set at that time to now be as follows:

(Original) 36" spruce N.10 E. 104 lks, reported on above as a 49" uproot
with axe marks visible on partially open blaze; (Now a rotten mound).

(Wilkes 1922) 36" spruce S.89 W. 90 lks., reported on above as a 56"
spruce with scribe mark "S" visible on partially open blaze; (Found, now
52" spruce stump with scribe mark "S" visible).

(T.C.S. Map #A-719) 16" spruce S.3 W. 30.2'; (Found, now *30" spruce
leaning southerly South 28.81' rescribed EE 1/64 S6 BT CS. The distance
was measured to a finish nail with a Tillamook County Surveyors brass
washer in the face between the B and the T).

7" spruce N.16 E. 112 lks.; (Found, now 22" spruce with healed face
73.17' to a finish nail with a brass washer in a small blaze facing the
corner).

New Accessories

*14" spruce N.53 E. 9.25' scribed EE 1/64 S31 BT CS.

The distance was measured to a finish nail with a Tillamook County
Surveyors brass washer in the face between the B and the T.

*60" hat section post North 1.4'

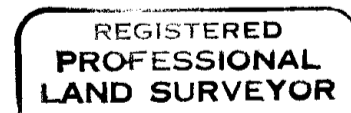
Location of Monument
