

# BAYSIDE SURVEYING

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## REWITNESS

¼ CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 35 and 34  
TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 8 WEST

I found:

OSBF brass cap on 1½" galvanized iron pipe stamped "¼ S34 S35 1952 2311" in stone mound with GLO stone with "¼" on northeast side. (See Rewitness Book 2, Page 203.)

From which:

Both GLO BTs very rotten:

46" Cedar stump with scribing "¼ S34 BT RE 2311" bears N72°W 26.5'. (N72°W 26.5'. See Rewitness Book 2, Page 203.)

68" fir stump with scribing "¼ S35 BT" bears N88°E 59.5'. (N88°E 59.5'. See Rewitness Book 2, Page 203.)

Note: monument appears to be in an active slide area, approximately 240' North of the road, but there are no ties to this corner from other corners to compare with. I held the monument as best evidence of the original GLO position.

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I set:

Set an orange carsonite post 4' North, and 2 New BTs as follows:

17" Douglas Fir scribed "¼ S34 BT" bears N72°W 12.35' to brass nail & washer stamped "LS 2507" between the B & T;

14" Douglas Fir scribed "¼ S35 BT" bears N33°E 33.07' to brass nail & washer stamped "LS 2507" between the B & T;
